Indian Rover Challenge - IRC 2018

VIT launches InDiaTel – the first health care product

nDiaTel – a devise that acquires various physiological data from patients suffering from diabetes to sent to doctors was launched by VIT. The devise has been created by School of Electrical Engineering (SELECT) – along with TMI Systems, Bengaluru. It is the outcome of a DST project by the School's faculty Associate Professor and is called "InDiaTel- Design and Development of Telemedicine based Health care unit for Diabetic Disorder." The device was launched on December 8, at Rajaji Hall, VIT. The devise can also send information nursing stations and clinics using wireless communication. The Product was launched by Dr. G. Viswanathan, Founder and Chancellor of VIT and handed over to Mr. Suresh Rangan Director of TMI Systems in the presence of UGC and AICTE committee members and the Vice Chancellor of VIT.

During the Launch the Chancellor said he was proud to launch such a devise and congratulated the principle investigator and also motivated others to design new products. Dr. P. Arulmozhiverman thanked the gathering and assured that the School will come up with more such similar innovations.



Mobile application to help talented visually impaired youth launched; Application developed by VIT students dedicated by Chancellor Dr. G. Viswanathan



A mobile application aimed at creating job opportunities for talented youth with visual impairment and developed by students of Vellore Institute of Technology University was launched by Dr. G.Viswanathan, Founder and Chancellor of the premier private institute on 30th January.

The mobile application – Project Envision – has been developed by student members of a club in the institute which was started only last year. To create adequate job opportunities to the visually impaired students and also to make their life better, Enactus, an organisation, has been functioning all over the world with student chapters in colleges and higher education institutions. These chapters functioning in the universities are called Enactus Students Club. In VIT, the Enactus Students Club was started last year.

In Tamil Nadu alone, there are an estimated seven lakh skilled people who are visually impaired. However, among them, only 10,000 manage to get jobs. As part of their attempts creating job opportunities for the visually impaired youth, the Enactus Students Club along with the Centre for Sustainable Rural Development & Research Studies (CSRD&RS) of VIT created this mobile application – Project Envision.

Speaking at a function to mark the dedication of the mobile application, Mr. G.V.Selvam, Vice President of VIT, said that the student members of Enactus Students Club were pioneers in the welfare of skilled visually impaired youth and that their work was worthy to be emulated and he expressed his appreciation to the students.



VIT, Vellore celebrated the 101st birth anniversary of late Dr MGR by garlanding his statue at Dr MGR Block (Main Building).




VIT Mathematical Meet 2018
