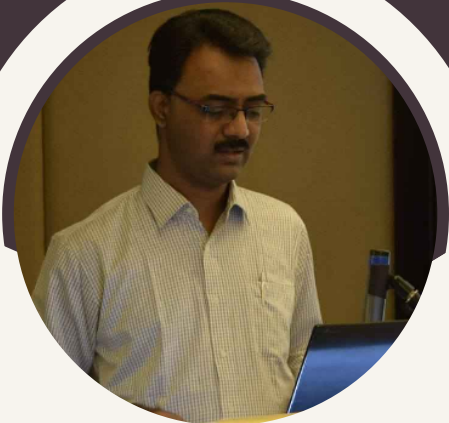

The workshop intends to introduce early career faculty and research scholars in English language and literature to the nuances of publishing research articles in Scopus / Web of Science indexed journals. Accordingly, the workshop will cover

- The recent trends in English studies
- Principles of editing, references and citations
- Strategies to improve quality of academic writing by discussing some examples of well-structured academic writing from literary and cultural studies.

INVITED SPEAKER

Dr. Sathyaraj Venkatesan is Professor of English in the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences at the National Institute of Technology, Tiruchirappalli, where he specializes in health humanities and comics studies, with an emphasis on graphic medicine. He earned PhD from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Kanpur. He was a Fellow at the School of Criticism and Theory at Cornell University, New York, and a Senior International Bibliographer with the Publications of Modern Language Association of America (PMLA). Venkatesan is the author/co-author/editor/co-editor of nine books: *Pandemics and Epidemics in Cultural Representation*, *Infertility Comics and Graphic Medicine*, *Mental Disorders and Graphic Medicine*, *Gender, Eating Disorders and Graphic Medicine*, *The Idea and Practice of Reading*, *Edgar Allan Poe: Tales and Other Writings*, *AIDS in Cultural Bodies: Scripting the Absent Subject* (1980-2010), and *Mapping the Margins: A Study of Ethnic Feminist Consciousness in Toni Morrison's Novels*.
